

Sir Donald Bradman Memorabilia





Today, Rodney and Regina Twiss launched their Bradman Memorabilia sitting room at the Melbourne Street Mews - A finely detailed and restored 1846 Cottage which already contains a number of Bradman era memorabilia.

This exceptional 2 bedroom and 2 fully tiled spa bathroom cottage now displays an actual Don Bradman signed Cricket bat, circa 1990 made of Indian Kashmiri Willow, encased in a display cabinet paying homage to 'The Don' 1908-2001. It compliments 2 of Don's armchairs from the early thirties in all their restored retro finery, where guests can recline and read through his almanac.

The cottage is only a short walk from the famous Adelaide Oval where a huge makeover, resulting in increased capacity, is in progress to be completed before the next Ashes held in late 2010. There is even talk of bringing the Oval's capacity up to AFL and world Football Cup standards.

For those who like to play a little, cricket nets actually exist in the North Parklands where guests can have a practice bowl and bat only 300 metres from their accommodation. (See our map).
